## "True Spiritual Principals are never in conflict; they compliment each other". —Tradition Two

Hi Family,

After an attempt to attend an Area Service commitment in May, I was encouraged to write this letter. I am currently serving as GSR of my home group.

I would first like to tell you just a little about me. My clean date is 12-6-93. I have served as H&I chair and Co-Chair, Merchandise Chair for 2 years, GSR, Secretary of my Area in Michigan, where I spent the first eight years of my recovery. This is the first service commitment to lead me to Area service since moving to Florida in 2004. Being a trusted servant has help me give back to the program that saved my life, and when I make the decision, with the guidance of my sponsor to serve, I do not take it lightly.

As we all know, we have the same Traditions and Concepts worldwide. What I have been taught is that the Region serves the Area, which serves the group, which serves the member. Our groups are here for the members. The groups provide a safe place to share and to find a new way of life. Tradition two tells us "For our group conscience, there is but one ultimate authority- a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern".

So the way I see it, those that came before us, they already knew. The meeting came before the book, and this is only a guess, but personalities and egos might have already been playing a part in the structure that was to come. They wrote lines in this tradition to help us remember that as trusted servants, trust has been placed

in us, not control. It is clearly stated. There is nothing left for us to have to try and figure out. It doesn't say "In this circumstance, it is ok to govern". That would be in my humble opinion, control and manipulation. Some of you may be wondering by now what provoked me to Plain and simple, I was being write. told where to sit at the Area Service meeting. I mentioned that you cannot tell people where to sit. When I asked the Chair what was the motive. I was told that it would all be explained to me in the meeting. Shouldn't the explanation take place prior to the direction? In the moment. I was not capable of doing anything but stepping away from the situation. I was not able to share my point of view in a loving manner. ..... What's the big deal? Why does it matter so much to me?

It is an abuse of the trust that members place in me, when I act in conflict with any of the traditions. I write about tradition two, because it gives good reference. I wasn't here yet when the traditions were written. My previous experience in service has shown me that when uniformity is promoted, rather than unity, what take place after are personal agenda, rather than group conscience. If it is where to sit today, what will it be next month? Please stay involved. Stay aware of what is happening. Aware of whom you vote into service. This may seam a small issue, but is an opportunity to pay attention.

At my home group business meeting, I will also make reference to the concepts that this goes against. If you are up for homework, they are numbers 6, 7, 9, 10, and 12.

## When is it Okay to be Happy?

For me I was allowed to grasp the principle of gratitude somewhat quickly due to a simple statement that someone once said to me, "A Grateful Addict Will Never Use." This statement opened an endless realm of possibilities in my life, and I adopted this as part of my daily living.

I was sometimes confused when I would sit in meetings and people would share about others that were always smiling and never anything going wrong in their life. I began to question and at one point even considered fabricating some type of horror story just so it would appear that I was going through something and fit in, and there was always the dreaded "Pink Cloud" theory.

After some extensive talking with other addicts and my newly found sponsor, the answer came. For me if there was such a thing as a "Pink Cloud", then

the answer was to ride it until the wheels fell off. In my case, recovery has afforded me things beyond anything ever imagined. I find that I am happiest when in service to others or the Fellowship.

Service has been the cornerstone of my recovery. Through service, God, as I understand Him, allows others to see His work, and that is, in my opinion the beginning of hope.

This is this addict's experience. Working the Steps N.A. teaches me that happiness is an inside job, for most of my life I sought happiness in people, places, things, and situations. My Higher Power continues to show that if His will is sought then happiness is one of the byproducts.
