How My Higher Power Got Me Through A Difficult Time

I was recently working as a Server in a very busy and very large upscale restaurant. I had been there 2 years at the time. I got promoted to a Server captain, which is basically a manager that also waits on tables. This position is

extremely physically and mentally demanding. About 5 days later I found out I was 6 weeks pregnant.

The job got harder, the hours got longer and the responsibilities where never-ending. The more pregnant I got, the harder the job would get. I was having breakdowns weekly, sometimes daily. I was faced with challenge after challenge. Being the solution-oriented person I have become I would experience problems that needed to be addressed and resolved, e.g. working up to 17 hours a day (at 4 months pregnant), live with it for too long, then identify it, then present it to my bosses and together we would come up with some kind of solution or compromise. I didn't want to quit, I wanted to be tough! This went on and on and by the 5th instance we kind of came to an impasse -- likely due to the fact that I was almost done. Everyone I worked with was trying so hard to make it work, but I finally reached a point where I thought, maybe I just need to surrender, surrender to the fact that this job does not fit me anymore, at this time. And that is OK, not failure but surrender.

I had one final breakdown and very ungracefully explained to my boyfriend that I couldn't do it anymore -- I just couldn't, not now, especially under these conditions. I further ungracefully explained that I needed him to pay all the bills and ASAP. I had nothing left. It had to end. He said, "No problem" and 3 days later he received a call, uninitiated, and was offered an amazing job. I was able to put in my two week notice and leave on great terms. His job covers our bills, savings, and then some. I was fighting for so long, trying to remain "tough" and all I needed to do was surrender. My Higher Power had me the whole time. Namaste.

IP No.22, "Welcome to NA"

Most of us come to Narcotics Anonymous with a variety of preconceptions about what the word "God" means, many of them negative. Yet the "G" word is used very regularly in NA, if not constantly. It occurs 92 times in the first 103 pages of our Basic Text, and appears prominently in a third of our Twelve Steps. Rather than sidestep the sensitivity many of us feel toward the word, let's address it head on.

My Higher Power at Work

I work at a local cable company in the Tampa Bay area. I work in the sales department and have been employed there for almost nine years. On my way to work this morning I was praying and talking to God and was quoting a scripture and was asking Him to hold me tight and carry me through the day. Once at work we were notified of a mandatory meeting and all sales reps were all directed to go into a training room. When I got to the door my spirit was uneasy and I felt very uneasy and did not want to go in. Then others behind me told me to move it! When I walked in I noticed the director of human resources in there and also two others from HR. Right away I felt like they were going to escort us all out the door. I closed my eyes and remembered the prayer I was praying on my way to work that morning and I asked God to wrap His arms around me and keep me safe, I actually leaned in my chair like He was holding me. It came to light in the meeting our 3 call centers (Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Polk) were going to one unit. If we wanted to stay in the Sales department we would be commuting to Auburndale every day which is 72 miles one way from my house. Second option would be to go to customer service which is a large pay cut or apply to another position in the company. I was still dumbfounded, but still leaning and praying. My mind was starting to cast off and go into that wide open mode that happens to a lot of us when we get in situations like this, and then my Higher Power kicked in. They then announced a third option that thirteen of us were selected to work from home. We would still need to go to Auburndale two to three times a month, but not every day. They started reading the names on the list and my name was called first and that warmth filled my body and I knew that God did for me what I could not do for myself. I started praying and thanking Him over and over at that point. Just for today it is going to be ok for me, God came through like just like I had prayed and


I was at my H&I commitment a couple weeks ago on Sunday night. There were two of us that went in, we both shared our ES&H then opened the floor up for a few minutes. The second to last guy raised his hand & said, "I'm Jason & I'm an addict.....WOW!!
I'm an addict. I've never said that before. Thank you both for sharing what you shared, I can totally relate to what the both of you said, that's no coincidence. My Dad's always told me I have a problem. He's offered me help several times & here I sit in jail for the first time......with a wife & 4 kids at home. Wow, I'm an addict, I'm ready to take that help now. I can't wait to talk to my Dad and ask him for it!!"

I told him that he just wrote one of the best paychecks I've ever received. I always walk out of my H&I commitment on cloud 9, but I think I floated out on cloud 99 that evening. The next night I went to the Living Clean meeting in Safety Harbor and the quote above is what we read. Coincidence?? I think not. Definitely cannot deny the reality of how this program has worked in my life & in the lives of so many wonderful people in my life today.

Gratitude is an attitude, I sure can't deny just how grateful I am today.

···In All My Affairs···

've heard people say that they came to N.A. "Kicking and screaming." I came to N.A. kicking, screaming and being tasered by the police. I didn't get here gracefully, but I believe it was my Higher Power's will that brought me here. I fought it to the last moment, until I finally sat handcuffed in the back of a police car. Relief washed over me and I knew - the pain was in the resistance. The obsession to use was lifted in that same minute. Writing this, I smile at the literalness of this image, for what beauty there is in such clear evidence. Inside each painful moment of surrender is the growth that I seek in my life and in my recovery.

My surrender to the ways my disease manifests in other areas of my life hasn't been as easy, in part because I am sometimes in denial. The bitch is, I don't know that I am in denial until I am out of denial. (Again, what a gift awareness is!) Often, the awareness and the shattering of my old beliefs come through step work. When I got here, I believed that the drugs were my problem. After some time clean, I know drugs were a solution to a preexisting problem - ME! Every diseased behavior I have brings consequences, but the bottoms I reached from using drugs were the worst.

I remember reading that "self-centeredness is the core of our disease" in the Basic Text. I had no concept of how true that was until I began doing step work. I was consumed by self-loathing and self-pity for as long as I can remember. I can use anything to try to change the way I feel about myself. One of the most painful battles I have faced is the one with my eating disorder. My eating disorder is just another a desperate attempt to control the way I feel about myself, but by changing my physical appearance instead of altering my state of mind. I have always placed a high value on physical appearances because I thought that people who looked good felt good. My self-centeredness told me I was the only person who felt so terrible inside. I judged my insides from other people's outsides. I truly believed, and sometimes still do, that if I am physically attractive I will be content and happy. I still notice myself thinking "when I have longer hair or when I see more results from the gym, then I will love myself." I see this as placing conditions on my acceptance and also on my surrender.

The progression of my eating disorder was similar to that of my drug use. What began as "just this once" turned into "just this once - a day" and ended with "I can't stop." Sound familiar? I hid it from co-workers, my long-term partner and most of my support group. I tried different methods or combinations and came up with bizarre rules for eating. I obsessed about my weight and what I was eating and compulsively threw it all up. Even when I didn't want to do it, I was powerless. The obsessive thoughts eventually won and I would be off to the "dope hole" - my toilet. I felt insane and utterly hopeless. I didn't believe I would ever gain relief from this part of my disease.

It was huge when I finally recognized that I could use the program of Narcotics Anonymous in this, or any, area of my life. I surrendered. I am powerless over my addiction, no matter what form it takes on. This behavior could kill me, the same as drugs. I began to take it one day at a time, one meal at a time and I haven't acted out compulsively since the day before Thanksgiving. I started telling on myself when I was thinking of binging or purging. Most importantly, I started a routine of REGULAR exercise. When I exercise regularly, I have almost no obsessive thoughts or guilt about what I eat. I have also come to a new place of self-acceptance. My body is not my worth, but it is a home for my spirit. In that way, I will nurture it and care for it as it deserves.

I had a sponsee describe her eating disorder as the "quietest" part of her disease. Like a wolf in sheep's clothing, I think often the most seemingly innocuous behaviors wind up being the most dangerous because I am able to rationalize and justify them easier. I view a refusal to correct a harmful behavior I am aware of as a reservation in my program of recovery. To me, "living clean" encompasses every aspect of my life. I believe that once my denial is shattered and I gain awareness on a defect or behavior that is causing unmanageability in my life, I then have a choice to do something differently.

There is a cliche that flows around the rooms of N.A. like coffee - "when the pain gets great enough, we do something different." The hope for me is that I no longer have to wait until the pain is so great. My periods of kicking and screaming are much shorter and quieter. I have achieved the promise of Narcotics Anonymous, freedom. Freedom is the ability to choose, and I choose to recover.

One Promise, Many Gifts

Page 102 of our Basic Text which says, "Narcotics Anonymous offers only one promise and that is freedom from active addiction, the solution that eluded us for so long." Sometimes, this important quote seems shared in meetings as though it means that all you can expect here is freedom from using drugs (even if your life sucks in so many other ways). And yet, from this one promise come so many gifts! What I have learned in NA is that my addiction is about much, much more than just using drugs. I have a disease of mind, body, and spirit that affects absolutely every area of my life. If I am given freedom from active addiction, I am given so much more than freedom from using drugs!

Here are some of the wonderful and miraculous gifts which come from our one, all-inclusive promise!

We enjoy a feeling of release and freedom from the desire to use. (Basic Text, 5th Ed., P.88)

We will be freed from our self-made prisons. (BT, P. 102)

We are no longer compelled to act against our true nature and to do things that we don't really want to do. (BT, P.86)

We emerge as new individuals with an awareness of ourselves and the ability to take our places in the world. (BT, P.94)

We find ourselves doing and enjoying things that we never thought we would be doing. (BT, P.98)

We become feeling people, capable of responding appropriately to life. (BT, P.94)

We lose the fear of touching and being touched. (BT, P.88)

We come to know happiness, joy and freedom. (BT, P.88)

We experience real love and real friendship. (BT, P.88)

We become able to make wise and loving decisions, based on principles and ideals that have real value in our lives. (BT, P. 101)

Lost dreams awaken and new possibilities arise. (BT, P.88)

Faith has replaced our fear and given us freedom from ourselves. (BT, P.101)

Life takes on a new meaning, a new joy, and a quality of being and feeling worthwhile. We become spiritually refreshed and are glad to be alive. (BT, P.51)

As the inner chaos we lived with for so long subsides,

we begin to experience long periods of serenity. (It Works, P. 104)

Where before we went from one extreme to another, either feeling better than everyone else or feeling worthless, we now find the middle ground where true self-worth can flourish. (IW, P. 103)

We grow spiritually and find that we are truly gaining a new level of freedom in our lives. Our past is just that: the past. We have put it behind us so that it no longer hovers on the edge of our thoughts, waiting for a chance to haunt our present. (IW, P. 94)

We saw that, by making our spiritual development our primary focus, other aspects of our lives would progress naturally as they were meant to all along. (IW, P. 117)

We see that, regardless of the presence or absence of material success in our lives, we can be content. We can be happy and fulfilled with or without money, with or without a partner, with or without the approval of others. We've begun to see that God's will for us is the ability to live with dignity, to love ourselves and others, to laugh, and to find great joy and beauty in our surroundings. Our most heartfelt longings and dreams for our lives are coming true. These priceless gifts are no longer beyond our reach. They are, in fact, the very essence of God's will for us. (IW, P. 112)

In other words, it's true that we may not be promised "a rose garden", but, even better, we are promised that whatever kind of garden life offers us, we can be happy and fulfilled and content, as well as clean!



When we take the actions indicated in the steps, the results are a change in our personality. It is our actions that are important. We leave the results to our Higher Power.




One of these days I'll end this plea, ending 5 lonely nights of numbing my pain, my misery. For 6 pm has come and went and the pain without my son I must sircumvent.

I remember when I came to NA I felt hopeless and useless and felt a pain so deep in the pit of my soul that I didn't care if I lived or died. All I cared about was having one more and I put that before anything else in my life. I remember a year ago I was crying on a couch thinking, I was going to live this way for the rest of my life. I believed everyone lived this way, but some could just hide it better than others. When I came in I was so beat down mentally, physically and spiritually and so many of the people in here had been to, and I heard them sharing about things like fears, hope, and strength. After so many horrible things that had happened to them or they had done, they could share about it and still smile and not use drugs. They even loved me when I couldn't love myself, which i am still learning how to do. I feel like, when I came in to these rooms, was the moment my life started. I was told I never had to use again among many other uplifting things. Which was a foreign concept for me and didn't make any sense at the time. But I kept coming back and working the program that people suggested to start a new way of life. I am not the same person I was when I came in, because I changed so much of what I thought defined me as a person. I find myself frustrated sometimes because words cannot begin to describe how NA changed my life, and saved my life. Today if I have a real problem, my problem actually has a solution. I have finally found a peace and happiness I thought I would never be able to obtain or even deserved. Above all I am learning how to ask for help and help others who hurt as bad as I used to.

The more help we can have translating the ideas in the proposals to actual practice on a local level, the easier it will be for us to frame a transition plan to present at WSC 2014. Without skipping a beat I gave him the ring and told him "now you do too". Hey, as he pointed out I've had sex, the least I could do was give him a cool ring". So I guess even though no one thought I should make this trip... I was suppose to come to Orlando so I could be reminded that I'm cool and and have had sex.... 
The Journey Continues
